After completing almost two years of my tenure as the Dean of the Faculty of Nursing, I am delighted to announce that I feel very fortunate to be holding this post. Our students and all members of the staff have contributed immensely towards making the Faculty of Nursing very productive and result-oriented. Although we are facing challenging financial circumstances and infrastructure issues at present, we remain positive and focused on our mission, which is to educate our students. However, there is a backlog of clinical training and examinations due to the postponement of those activities due to the COVID-19 pandemic.



2.1 nEURO care Project- European initiative for capacity building to meet the challenges of caring for people with Neurodegenerative Disorders in Sri Lanka

Inauguration Ceremony and the Workshop

The Inauguration Ceremony of the nEUROcare capacity building project of the Faculty of Nursing, University of Colombo was held on 7th February 2022 at Waters Edge, Battaramulla at 8.30am followed by an international workshop with the participation of members from four Sri Lankan universities and four European universities. The aim of this project is to develop new and innovative courses and methodologies in healthcare in order to develop the human capacities in the field of Neurodegenerative Disorders within the four selected Higher Education Institutions of Sri Lanka.



Senior Professor Chandrika N. Wijeyaratne, Vice Chancellor, University of Colombo participated as the Chief Guest. In addition, Professor Sanath Dammika, Deputy Vice Chancellor, General Sir John Kotelawala Defense University, Prof. S.S.P. Warnakulasuriya, the Dean, Faculty of Nursing, University of Colombo, Dr. A.R.N. Silva, Acting Dean, Faculty of Allied Health Sciences, General Sir John Kotelawala Defense University and representatives from the faculties of Allied Health Sciences, University of Ruhuna and University of Peradeniya graced the occasion.



The Project coordinator, Prof. Martin Persson, Kristianstad University, Sweden and other representatives from three European universities such as Triskelion University, Norway, University of Ljubljana, Slovenia, University of Tartu, Estonia and Neapolis University Pafos, Cyprus, also participated in this event. In addition, project managers and project members of all four local universities such as University of Colombo, General Sir John Kotelawala Defense University, University of Peradeniya and University of Ruhuna attended the inauguration ceremony.



The international workshop continued after the inauguration ceremony from 7th to 11th February 2022. A total of 25 participants (project managers and project members) from all four local universities and four partner EU universities participated in the workshop. The aim of the workshop was to develop the course structure for Master's Degree, Diploma and Certificate program on Neurodegenerative disorders based on Sri Lankan Qualification Framework. Development of these courses were facilitated by a Neurosurgeon, a Neurologist, a Psychologist and a General physician from EU partner universities. Trainers from local universities were facilitated to improve the provision of care for the patients with neurodegenerative diseases through these courses.

Identification and molecular profiling of a novel homolog of cystatin C from rock bream (*Oplegnathus fasciatus*) evidencing its transcriptional sensitivity to pathogen infections

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Abstract

Cystatins are reversible inhibitors of cysteine proteases which show an omnipresent distribution in the life on earth. Although, cystatins with mammalian origin were well characterized and their roles in physiology were reported in details, those from teleostean origin are still underrepresented in literature. However, role of cystatins in fish physiology and immune defense is highlighted in few recent reports. In this study, a cystatin C holmologue from rock bream (*Oplegnathus fasciatus*); termed RbCytC was identified and molecularly characterized. The complete coding sequence of RbCytC was 387 bp in length, which codes for a polypeptide with 129 amino acids, including a signal peptide of 19 amino acids. The consensus cystatin family

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
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5. Celebrations

5.1 International Nurses' Day Celebrations 2021

Florence Nightingale, known as “The Lady with the Lamp” is the founder of modern professional nursing. She was a strong lady who could bring a reputation for the nursing community becoming an icon in Victorian culture during the Crimean war. In order to pay tribute to her uttermost contribution to the field of nursing, the International Council of Nurses (ICN) has declared 12th May as the International Nurses’ Day as it is the birth anniversary of the Lady Florence Nightingale. All nursing professionals around the world proudly celebrate International Nurse’s Day every year.

This year International Nurses’ Day is very significant for the Sri Lankan nursing community-due to two reasons. One reason is that today nursing is becoming one of the most demanding professions in Sri Lanka and globally as all sectors have identified the value of nursing significantly with this global Covid-19 pandemic. During this pandemic, their extraordinary contribution and inspiration have proved their dedication towards nursing. The second reason is, the nursing education sector of Sri Lanka has reached a landmark as Professor Sudath Warnakulasuriya (Dean of the Faculty of Nursing, University of Colombo) has become the 1st Nursing Professor in Sri Lanka.



The Faculty of nursing as the only faculty for nursing in Sri Lanka, proudly commemorated the International Nurses’ Day on 13th May 2021 under the theme declared by the ICN for the year 2021 “Nurses: A Voice to Lead – A Vision for Future

Healthcare” via zoom conferencing. Respectable invitees, academic staff members and students participated in this event.

At the beginning, the theme of International Nurses’ Day was highlighted by playing a short video. Then Prof. Sudath Warnakulasuriya, Dean of the Faculty of Nursing warmly welcomed the invitees; Senior Prof. Chandrika Wijeratne, the Vice Chancellor of the University of Colombo, Ms. R.A.D.R. Priyadarshanie, Chief Nursing Officer of the Colombo South Teaching Hospital, Ms. A.N. After that a song cover named “Suwawiruwa” voiced by the students of the Faculty of Nursing was played in order to acknowledge the healthcare workers fighting at the frontline of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Next a speech competition was conducted as part of the International Nurses’ Day Celebrations 2021. The 1st round of the speech competition was held in the previous week and the best speakers of each batch were selected from a very tight competition and those 3 competitors presented very interesting and informative speeches on this day in front of the attendees.

Then, the Vice Chancellor, Senior Prof. Chandrika Wijeratne addressed the gathering. First and foremost, she expressed her appreciation and gratitude for organizing such a well-planned event and acclaimed the wonderful work of the nursing population in Sri Lanka and the world over in the current crisis of Covid-19. Further she elaborated that the voice of great Lady Florence Nightingale probably supports this great work as she was also born during a period of pandemic 200 years ago. Moreover, the vice-chancellor highly appreciated the growth of the faculty and congratulated the three students who made very interesting speeches.

After the speech of the Vice Chancellor, a song cover (Heal the world) voiced by the students of the Faculty of Nursing was presented. Next Dr. Gnanaselvam Kisokanth, Head of the Department of Clinical Nursing, Mrs. Ranjani Nettasinghe, Head of the

6.1 Best oral presentation- 2nd International Conference on Public Health and Well-being- 2021.

A prosthesis is an artificial device that replaces a missing body part, which may be lost through trauma, disease, or a condition present at birth (congenital disorder).

Prostheses are used to compensate a loss of a limb aesthetically and functionally.

Do prostheses meet our expectations?

The extent to which the prosthesis does its job, is questionable.

Hence, the purpose of this study was to determine the prosthetic satisfaction among the unilateral below knee amputees in Sri Lanka.






